

City of Los Angeles Releases Annual Minimum Wage Increase for Hotel Workers

The City of Los Angeles released its increased minimum wage for hotels in the City of LA with 150+ rooms. On **July 1, 2020**, the hourly minimum wage increases from \$16.63/hour to **\$17.13/hour** for these hotel workers. The City of Santa Monica has its own Hotel Worker Minimum Wage Ordinance, which follows the City of Los Angeles wage rates. Thus, on July 1, 2020, the hourly minimum wage for hotel employees in the City of Santa Monica also increases from \$16.63 to \$17.13/hour.

As a reminder, this wage increase applies to all hotels located in Santa Monica, regardless of the number of rooms, whereas the wage increase only applies to hotels located in the City of Los Angeles with 150+ rooms.
